## **Speaking Out: Taking Action**

#### Pope Francis speaks out, again

In 2015 Pope Francis called for "Care for Our Common Home." In his most recent exhortation on the climate crisis, the Pope says that "our responses have not been adequate, while



the world in which we live is collapsing and may be nearing the breaking point."

In "Laudate Deum" the Pope doubled down on his earlier call for urgent action to tackle climate change, while also criticizing a failing global response to the crisis. But he also called out Americans for having an oversized

influence on the climate. "If we consider that emissions per individual in the United States are about two times greater than those of individuals living in China, and about seven times greater than the average of the poorest countries, we can state that a broad change in the irresponsible lifestyle connected with the Western model would have a significant long-term impact," he writes. "As a result, along with indispensable political decisions, we would be making progress along the way to genuine care for one another."

# The Pope warns against believing that our problems will be solved by technical interventions saying, "We risk remaining trapped in the mindset of pasting and papering over cracks.

**Bill McKibben comments** on the Pope's writing saying, "Yes, the engineers have done their job. Yes, the scientists have done their job. But it's high time for the human heart to do its job. And that's what we need this leadership for so, so badly." <u>Read more here.</u>

**The "GPGP" is twice the size of Texas.** The 3rd generation of this massive plastic cleanup operation is now

underway, bringing home 45 tons of plastic with each trip. An estimated 80,000 tons of plastic is in this area.
