

It's no secret. In this 887 page document entitled *Mandate for Leadership, The Conservative Promise*, the far-right think tank Heritage Foundation and 80

other right wing organizations present a "battle plan" for the first 180 days of a future Republican presidency. It applies not only to the election in November but forthcoming elections as well. African TREES The United Nations Environment Programme awarded Trees for the

UK leaving the "dangerous and destructive" Energy Charter Treaty (ECT). The ECT allows fossil fuel companies to sue countries for taking climate action, and the UK withdrawing is a huge win for the environmental movement and the planet. According to a spokesperson "the fight is still far from over — but this news shows that people-power works. Campaigning for climate action works. So let's keep pushing, let's keep taking action — together." Here's the article.



The Reuse Center in Denmark Every morning, about 50 to 100 people gather in line in front of a center owned by the municipality of Aarhus, the secondlargest city in Denmark. Here, they can give – and take – all sorts of materials for free. More than two metric tons [4400 lbs; the weight of 4 horses] of objects pass through the center per day, all of which can be brought to new owners' homes via cargo bikes the city lends to citizens. "I believe it's good for the environment," one participant says. "There's no need to buy new stuff." <u>Read more.</u>

Future (TREES) the status of "Restoration Flagship." Since it was founded in 2015, the programme has planted tens of millions of trees each year in nine countries ranging from Senegal and Mali to Tanzania and Kenya. In less than 10 years, it has reportedly restored a combined area of more than 41,000 hectares, which is about 100,000 football fields or seven times the size of Manhattan. This includes part of the African Union's Great Green Wall initiative, a planned barrier of vegetation, 9 miles wide by 5,000 miles long, to hold back the deserts that are encroaching across the Sahel region. Organisers say this will be the largest natural structure on the planet, though it is still very much a work in progress. Read more.



The South Bay Salt Pond Restoration Project

This ambitious project in San Francisco Bay aims to reclaim over 15,000 acres of shoreline from 150 years of commercial salt production and return it to tidal wetland and other habitats for local and migratory birds, endangered endemic species and other wildlife. <u>Read and see more</u>.
