"When growing the economy is not the right answer" Excerpts and transcript from The Next System Project I think we need to diagnose the problem as economic growth. Economic growth inherently requires resource use, and we know that some

resources are nonrenewable. There's resource depletion. But also crucially, using said resources is damaging our climate, our biodiversity, and so forth. So the root problem is really economic growth.

Indeed it might well follow that de-growth, the process in which we move to an economy that uses fewer resources, that does not need to grow to function effectively, providing us all with a decent quality of life, is the way to go.

I think we shouldn't overly rely on what individual behavior change can do. What's more likely to lead to success is politicizing issues around consumption, around business practice, and asking for change from our legislators.


