**South Korea's composting system is a model for the world.** South Korea operates a comprehensive composting program that recycles almost all of its discarded food into fertilizer, animal feed or biogas. In the city of Seoul, population 10 million, this means 2,500 tons of food waste a day is recycled into usable material. Food waste accounts for 6-8% of human-caused greehouse gas emissions. Household waste is collected in yellow bags and treated at a central location. (It doesn't say what these bags are made of or if they can be recycled...) <u>Here's the story.</u>

#### Let's understand light years a little more

Last month I posted an image by one of our favorite news commentators, Robert Hubbell, who is also a skilled amateur photographer specializing in telescopic photographs of the night sky. He always notes how many light years these nebulae are from Earth. Here is Nebula Sharpless 2-108. It is 1,500 light years from Earth and has a diameter of 26 light years. He explains "light years:" Light travels 5.88 trillion miles in a year. For comparison, the Earth is 93.6 million miles from the Sun. Driving a car at 60 miles an hour without a break would take about 11,000 years to drive one light year. If you drove day and night at 60 miles per hour without stopping, it would take you 286,000 years to drive across Sharpless 2-108.
