#### California takes on fast fashion

The environmental impact of the fashion industry is becoming increasingly difficult to ignore, and California is leading the way in addressing the growing issue of textile waste. With the fast fashion cycle overwhelming consumers and landfills, California's new law,

### **Banning Fossil Fuel Advertising**

The Hague has become the first city in the world to pass a law banning advertisements promoting fossil fuel products and "climate-busting" services. Legislation spells the end of publicly and privately funded advertising for petrol and diesel, aviation and cruise ships in the streets of the Dutch city, including on billboards and bus shelters. It takes effect from the start of next year. Read more.

#### Bye bye smartphones in class

As this school year gets underway, a growing number of schools are banning or restricting smartphones. France has banned them in primary and secondary schools since 2018, the Netherlands since the beginning of this year, and Italy, Germany and Great Britain are currently discussing implementing restrictions. In the US, Florida passed a law last year that bars students from using personal digital devices in public schools, and several other states, including Indiana, Louisiana and South Carolina, are following suit starting this school year.
