# Meet MAGA: A primer on fascism

**Beginning in 1943,** the War Department published a series of pamphlets for U.S. Army personnel in the European theater of World War II. Titled *Army Talks*, the series was designed to help [the personnel]



become better-informed men and women and therefore better soldiers. On March 24, 1945, the topic for the week was FASCISM! Excepts from the pamphlet follow.

"It is vitally important to learn to spot native fascists, even though they adopt names and slogans with popular appeal, drape themselves with the

American flag, and attempt to carry out their program in the name of the democracy they are trying to destroy.

"The only way to stop the rise of fascism in the United States is by making our democracy work and by actively cooperating to preserve world peace and security. In the midst of the insecurity of the modern world, the hatred at the root of fascism fulfills a triple mission. By dividing people, it weakens democracy. By getting men to hate rather than to think, it prevents them from seeking the real cause and a democratic solution to the problem. By falsely promising prosperity, it lures people to embrace its security."

The pamphlet ends by warning, "Fascism thrives on indifference and ignorance. Freedom requires being alert and on guard against the infringement not only of our own freedom but the freedom of every American. If we permit discrimination, prejudice, or hate to rob *anyone* of his democratic rights, our own freedom and all democracy is threatened."

<u>This article by historian Heather Cox Richardson</u> goes into the tactics, strategies and techniques for the development of the fascist state. It is concise and clear about the threats we are facing in today's America. I highly recommend it!

#### **Replacing Parking Spots with Trees**

A newly released plan would see 60,000 parking spots throughout Paris turn into grounds for tree planting by 2030. The goal of the project is to better prepare for extreme heat events by providing shaded green spaces. The plan still requires approval from the Council of Paris to move forward. Read more.

#### **Reverse Vending Machines**

In February 2023 Ireland introduced a bottle deposit return program. Since then 630 million cans and bottles have been dumped into return vending machines. The plan allows consumers to return cans and bottles for a refund of €0.15 (\$0.16) for cans and €0.25 (\$0.27) for plastic bottles. A PET (polyethylene terephthalate) bottle can be recycled seven times, while cans can be recycled indefinitely. Read more here.
