# "FIGHT EVERYWHERE AND ALL AT ONCE"



"It's time to fight everywhere and all at once. Never before in my life have I called for mass protests, for mobilization, for disruption. But I am now."

In a fiery speech to Democrats in New Hampshire on April 28 Gov. of Illinois J.B. Prtizker laid out what's before us.

"These Republicans cannot know a moment of peace. They have to understand that we will fight their cruelty with every megaphone and microphone that we have. We must castigate them on the soap box, and then punish them at the ballot box. They must feel in their bones that when we survive this shameful episode of American history with our democracy intact—because we have no alternative but to do just that—that we will relegate their portraits to the museum halls reserved for tyrants and traitors.

"Cowardice can be contagious, but so too can courage, just as the hope that we hold onto in the darkness shines with its own special light.

"Tonight, I'm telling you what I'm willing to do, and that is to fight—for our democracy, for our liberty, for the opportunity for all our people to live lives that are meaningful and free. And I see around me tonight a roomful of people who are ready to do the same.

"So I have one question for all of you, Are you ready for the fight?"

## Stitch it. Don't Ditch It.

Resisting fast fashion can be fun! Meet the Edinburgh Street Stitchers. The fashion industry is responsible for 92 million metric tons of textile waste annually, and the dyeing and finishing of textiles causes 20 percent of industrial water pollution. Due to energy-intensive production and long supply chains, the apparel industry is responsible for eight to ten percent of global carbon emissions—more than aviation and shipping combined. Inspired by the global Street Stitching movement, the former pharmacist Mary Morton started the Edinburgh group in 2022 after a discussion with her son sent her down a rabbit hole of research and learning about the climate crisis. "At the end of all of that, I was absolutely horrified. I thought, 'What can I do about it?'"
