The Preamble of our Constitution

I came upon this theme for the newsletter after watching a couple of videos produced by the More Perfect Union Foundation, a non-profit education organization. (Links below.) They presents a poignant look at poor rural America where folks feel utterly neglected and are without basic services. They voted for Trump in 2024 because he promised to fix the "broken system" and make things better for them. What comes forward from these videos is that **the deeper issue for Americans may not be the political divide of red vs. blue, right vs. left so much as the inequality divide and right vs. wrong.**

"The wealth inequality in our country is astounding and worsening. In 1970, 61% of the U.S. population was considered middle class. It's now down to 50% and shrinking. Today, the top 1% of Americans hold 31% of the wealth; the bottom half holds just 2.6%. We all might want to pause to fully consider those percentages." —Dan Rather. More inequality numbers

The four richest men in the US are worth more than \$1.3tn. But it's not just them. The top 1% now owns more wealth than the bottom 93%.

Elon Musk, worth \$480bn, owns more wealth than the bottom 52% of American households. Tesla's board proposed giving him a \$1tn pay package if he meets certain goals.

800,000 Americans are homeless and more than 20m households pay over 50% of their limited incomes on rent or a mortgage. Since 2000, average rents have more than doubled and the median price of a home has soared to more than \$435,000. Real weekly wages for the average American worker are lower today than they were more than 52 years ago.

According to the Economic Policy Institute, over the past 45 years, top CEO compensation increased by 1,085%, while their typical worker's salary inched up by just 24%.

More than 85 million Americans are uninsured or underinsured – a number that will rise by at least 15 million under Trump's so-called big beautiful bill.

The UN High Seas Treaty

"This is a super big deal, both for ocean protection and for proving that there's still hope in multilateralism, that countries can come together and do big things, even in these times where there's so much discord across the world," Arlo Hemphill, an oceans project lead at Greenpeace USA. The pact, now ratified by 60 nations, gives governments power to establish vast conservation zones across the two thirds of the ocean beyond national borders Here's the article.



Healthier School Meals

California lawmakers are awaiting the governor's signature on a first-of-its-kind bill to define and ban ultra-processed foods in school meals. The state has already ditched certain food dyes; now it's aiming for fresher, less-processed lunches. With 20 states having initiated a similar ban on synthetic food dyes, there's hope that this new bill could set off a similar "California effect." Read here.



Ozone Layer Recovery

In another example of multinational cooperation the UN Meteorological Organization announced that it expects a full recovery of the ozone layer by mid-century. The ozone layer in the stratosphere absorbs a portion of the radiation from the sun, preventing it from reaching the planet's surface. Most importantly, it absorbs the portion of UV light called UVB. UVB is a kind of ultraviolet light from the sun (and sun lamps) that has several harmful effects. UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres said, "This achievement reminds us that when nations heed the warnings of science, progress is possible." Read more here.



River Restoration in China

China has made remarkable progress in cleaning and restoring its "mother river," the Yangtze. This 3 minute video takes you on a trip down the river to show the cleanup operation in progress. It explains that garbage is now incinerated to generate electricity, chemical pollution is reduced and fishing banned. It describes the challenges that still remain in this modern world.
