Secretary General of the United Nations Antonio Guterres recalled that his youth in Portugal was spent "in the darkness of dictatorship, where fear silenced voices and hope was nearly crushed. Yet, even in the bleakest hours—especially then—I discovered a truth that has never left me: power does not reside in the hands of those who dominate or divide. Real power resides from people, from our shared resolve to uphold dignity, to defend

equality, to believe—fiercely—in our common humanity, and the potential of every human being. . . . I learned early to persevere. To speak out. To refuse to surrender, no matter the challenge, no matter the obstacle, no matter the hour. We must—and we will—overcome." —Antonio Guterres, Secretary General of the United Nations

# Pay-as-you-throw

Cut waste. Save cash. If you pay by the weight of your trash you're much more likely to throw away less. Over the last 30 years this waste system has been gaining traction across the Netherlands, Germany, Ireland, Belgium, France, Italy and Norway, as well as Taiwan, Japan, Canada and the U.S. In the U.S. over 7,000 towns and cities have implemented such programs. They have been praised as one of the most effective tools for encouraging residents to throw out less — in some cases, reducing the amount of household trash by 30



#### **Declining Deforestation**

Deforestation in Brazil's Amazon rainforest has fallen to its lowest level in more than a decade, according to new government data.

"Even in my best-laid plans I would never have imagined that we would reach this point with a 50 percent reduction in deforestation," said Environmental Minster Marina Silva. ## Road Closed: Red Crabs Migrating

This is the time of year when millions of red crabs migrate from the rainforest of Christmas Island to the sea. Christmas Island is an Australian territory in the Indian Ocean near Indonesia. After a devastating infestation of the Yellow Crazy Ant the crab population has rebounded and now is estimated to be about 180
